IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR COMPETITORS

- Extra parking available for floats and horse trucks/goosenecks – enter through gateway next to Prices' Service Centre, and receive directions.
- Ring crew will be wearing bright shirts – crew are available to provide assistance and direction
- Drug Testing may be carried out at this show. Any competitor found to have breached the ASC Disputes and Disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee
- Warming up allowed in ring until 8am sharp.
- ALL DOGS must be TIED UP or on a LEASH.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. ALL COMPETITORS COMPETE AT THE THEIR OWN RISK
2. No competitor will be eligible to compete in any ring event unless the competitor (if over 18), or parent or guardian (if under 18) has signed a waiver and is wearing a wrist band.
3. All protests must be made in writing and addressed to the Ring Secretary within 30 minutes of the event, accompanied by a protest fee of \$50 **(non-refundable)**.
4. The judge has the right to disqualify any entry that does not conform to the schedule. Judge's decision is final.
5. Competitors only to enter the ring. Spectators and others are not permitted within the ring and must leave when instructed. All competitors must be ready to compete when called.
6. All competitors must wear an approved safety equipment appropriate to their event. This rule will be strictly adhered to, there are no exceptions.
7. Children under 18 years are not permitted to exhibit or lead a stallion or colt.
8. Stallions and colts may compete in jumping and designated stallion classes only.
9. Stallions and colts to be controlled with a bit or chain and double tied at all times.
10. Show Hunter Ponies, Galloways and Hacks must nominate in **EITHER** Show Hunter classes or Open Hack classes **NOT BOTH**.
11. **NOVICE:** Horse or rider that has not won a first prize in a similar event at any ASC Show.
12. **INTERMEDIATE:** A horse that has not won an individual ribbon in any hack event at any Royal Show.
13. **LOCAL CLASSES:** Ponies, Galloways and Hacks include both open horses and hunter horses in local classes only.
14. Riders can only be led where stated in the program.
15. Classes will not be delayed for a competitor to present to the judge, except for Championship classes.



QUALIFYING REGULATIONS

OFF THE TRACK NSW (OTT NSW) INC OFFICIAL QUALIFYING REGULATION

Off The Track is open to all Thoroughbreds that have been lodged in a stable return for pre-training and race preps, & those that have officially raced or barrier trialled, locally, nationally or internationally.

- All horses are required to be 3 years and over and be no less than 14.2hh.
- All horses will be registered with Racing Australia. Registrations and stable returns for those that did not make it to the races will be checked.
- Racing Name is to be used other than those that were unnamed due to injuries during pre-training etc. In this instance, please contact us before entering classes for your clearance.
- Qualifying shows must be affiliated with The Agricultural Societies of NSW Ltd, or Show Horse Council of Australasia Inc.
- Off The Track NSW Qualifying classes will be judged as separate classes. Led, Ridden, Rider Classes, Show jumping, Dressage & Fashions of the Field.
- Any horse that has won Champion cannot compete in other qualifiers within the season.
- The season is a calendar year. Any place getters at other finals are NOT Permitted to enter the Off The Track NSW Inc Finals/Championships. Please choose your finals ahead of time. Any horse that qualifies under OTT NSW Inc IS NOT eligible to use our qualifiers for other clubs/organisations. Once an OTT has won Champion that horse cannot compete in other qualifiers within the season.
- Horses that have won Reserve Champion or Runner up may continue. Any horse that has won a Champion or Reserve Off The Track NSW in the past 3 years but has NOT won a place at other finals are eligible to enter the Off The track NSW Inc Finals/Championships. This includes OTT NSW Show Jumping Champions.
- The committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason for doing so and to alter the program/schedule at their discretion.
- Horses will be judged as a good example of a thoroughbred, rather than that of a riding horse/hunter type, with the following taken into consideration:

(a) Thoroughbred qualities. (b) Conformation. (c) Manners. (d) Paces & performance.

Injuries caused through racing, such as blemishes, are allowed.

Judges' decision is final in the qualifiers, and the state finals/championships.

Horse and owner must reside in NSW to compete in the Off the Track NSW Inc Series.

Every horse that enters the finals/championships must be ridden by the same rider that qualified the horse, unless the horse has been sold. In this case the new owner may apply to Off The Track NSW Inc at least one month prior to nominations.

OFF THE TRACK NSW SPECIAL SHOWJUMPING CLASSES

- 1) This event is open to all thoroughbreds that have officially raced or barrier trialed either locally, nationally or internationally. For those that have had a race preparation, but did not make it to the races & are unnamed, please contact Off The Track NSW at least 14 days before the event to get your clearance.
- 2) All horses are required to be 3yrs & over & also be over 14.2hh. All horses will have been registered with Racing Australia. Registrations will be checked.
- 3) Racing Name is to be used, other than those that are pre-trained only, and are unnamed.
- 4) All of the OTT NSW Show Jumping events will be held under the rules/guidelines of EA.
- 5) The winner will be the most successful of 4 classes.
- 6) *1st & 2nd Place are eligible for the Off The Track NSW Finals.*

HISTORY OF THE CJ SAVILLE CUP

Christopher James Saville arrived in Portland from England in about 1910 and worked for his much older cousin, John Saville Snr, who was the manager of the Standard Portland Cement Co. (and grandfather of Sue Thorne, nee Saville). After working in Portland for some years and marrying a local girl, Lee, Chris moved to Charbon, to open and manage the cement works there for the Company. Here he became friendly with Jack Blackmore, the founder and President of the Show Society. The CJ Saville Cup was given to the Show Society either by Chris himself or his family after his death, as a memorial trophy. Chris died in 1948 aged 61 and is buried in Rylstone Cemetery. It is thought that he died while still manager at the Cement Works.

250g (8oz) Sultanas	½ teaspoon Grated Nutmeg
250g (8oz) Chopped Raisins	½ teaspoon Ground Ginger
250g (8oz) Currants	½ teaspoon Ground Cloves
125g (4oz) Chopped Mixed Peel	250g (8 oz) Butter
90g (3oz) Chopped Red Glacé Cherries	250g (8oz) Soft Brown Sugar
90g (3oz) Chopped Blanched Almonds	½ teaspoon Lemon Essence or finely grated lemon rind
½ Cup Sherry or Brandy	½ teaspoon Almond Essence
250g (8oz) Plain Flour	½ teaspoon Vanilla Essence
60g (2oz) Self Raising Flour.	4 Large Eggs

Method:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least

4 hours, preferably overnight

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in slow oven approximately

3-4 hours. Allow to cool in tin

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds cross-wise into 3-4 pieces

6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
